# Albany Fish Trap Public Art Commission

Regional Arts WA, in partnership with the Western Australian Museum, is commissioning a public artwork to celebrate the ancient Menang Fish Traps on the Albany coastline. The project is part of the broader Reclaiming Kalyenup initiative to re-indigenise the Museum of the Great Southern's grounds.

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# Expression of Interest (EOI)

Artists submit a short proposal, CV, and images of past work.

# **Concept Design**

Up to 3 shortlisted artists receive mentoring and a \$2,500 fee to develop a detailed concept.

# **Detailed Design**

One artist/team is selected and paid \$25,000 to develop final design documents.

#### Who can apply

- First Nations artists from WA with Menang Noongar cultural ties (mentoring & support is available).
- Either as solo artists or lead artists within a creative team.

#### **Artwork Goals**

- Interpret and celebrate the 7,500+ year-old Menang Fish Traps.
- Embed Menang cultural knowledge and storytelling.
- Create a lasting, educational public artwork at the Museum of the Great Southern.

#### **Artwork Sites**

Artists can propose work for one or more of three sites:

- **Site 1:** In the tidal Amity Pond (marine environment).
- Site 2: Grassed area west of Brig Amity Replica.
- **Site 3:** East of Brig Amity, near native plantings and boardwalk.

#### **Design Considerations**

- Must be durable in marine/saline conditions.
- Safe for public interaction (especially children).
- Materials must be corrosion-resistant and environmentally safe.

### Budget

- Stage ONE: no fee for EOI
- Stage TWO fee: \$2,500 for each shortlisted artist.
- **Stage THREE fee:** \$25,000 for final artist (covers all design costs).
- **Stage FOUR:** Total artwork fabrication and installation budget: \$150,000.

#### **Submission Requirements (Stage ONE)**

#### Include:

- Completed Identification Form.
- Artist CV or bio (max 2 pages).
- Up to 10 images of past work.
- Short written concept/storyline (max 1 page).
